

Required Submission of Health Record

In accordance with the Commonwealth of Virginia and the American College Health Association Immunization Guidelines 2012, Radford University policy requires that all students shall provide a Health Record with documented immunizations prior to enrollment. This policy helps ensure the health of all students by reducing the possibility of communicable disease on the Radford University campus. Any student not providing such record will be restricted from registering for his or her second semester per Radford University policy.

Please complete the attached Health Record and submit it directly to the Student Health Center as soon as you anticipate becoming a Radford University student. The deadlines are listed on the form. It is extremely important that you do not delay in this process so that your second semester registration is not prohibited.

If you have previously attended Radford University and have previously submitted a Student Health Record, please contact the Student Health Center to confirm that they have the form on file or if any additional or updated immunization information is required. Any questions regarding a previously submitted Student Health Record will be directly answered by the Student Health Center; the Graduate College does not have access to this information.

America College Health Association Immunization Guidelines 2012: Prematriculation Immunizations

The following recommendations are provided to colleges and universities to facilitate the implementation of a comprehensive institutional prematriculation immunization policy. Vaccine preventable diseases continue to occur on and near campuses. In response to changing epidemiology and the introduction of new vaccines, the ACHA Vaccine Preventable Diseases Advisory Committee monitors age appropriate public health recommendations and updates this document accordingly. The committee recognizes that many colleges and universities are mandated by state law to require certain vaccinations for matriculating students. This document is intended as a guideline that is consistent with the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommendations published by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). –March 2012
